Dial a Ride Services

To use Dial a Ride services (operated between 8.30am and 5.30pm Monday to Friday) you must be a member of the scheme for your area. To become a member you must not have your own transport available or be able to access other forms of public transport. Age and disability are irrelevant. A 3 year membership fee of £5.00 for single members or £7.50 for joint members is required. Group membership is £5.00 per year.

Bookings can be made by calling the MATRIX booking line on 0845 456 4474 at least 2 hours before you wish to travel. Bookings cannot be accepted more than 7 days in advance. If the customers requested time of travel cannot be offered the nearest alternative will be offered. All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.

I dare say, many of you have never come into contact with your Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator. This could be that you do not have one. We are a bit short of Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators in the village.

They will be able to help you and ensure you are supplied with leaflets and regular update's on crime in the area.

Now that we are looking forward to the Summer. Many of you will be thinking about gardening and holidays. Here are a few tips that may assist you in the fight against crime.

- 1. Do not leave windows, or doors unlocked, whilst you are busy enjoying your garden.
- 2. Do not leave your garage door open if it is close to the road, as criminals driving past can see its contents and return when you are not there.

- 3. Make sure your garden shed is secure. A number of break-in's occur due to the woodscrews on hinges being removed. I suggest you invest in some dome headed bolts and nuts, and mark all the items with a uv-pen using your post code and house number as a reference.
- 4. Leave lights on and a radio, when you are out, and think about a timer switch if you are going to be away for any length of time.
- 5. If you do intend going away, make sure you cancel any regular deliveries, like milk or newspapers. You could also consider having a neighbor pop round to pick up your mail. These are all clear signs that you are away to any prospective burglar. You could also think of using the Royal Mail 'Keepsake' service.
- 6. Double check the security of the house prior to going away, especially upstairs. Ensure that any ladders are safely under lock and key.

Bogus Callers.

If you have a caller and are uncertain as to their Identity, use your security chain prior to opening the door. If the caller is a service engineer, check their I.D. If you are still unsure, close the door and telephone the company they say they are from to confirm their I.D. If they are genuine they will have no problem with waiting.

Last year with the help of the N.W., the Notts police caught a gang of bogus callers that were impersonating police officers. Their I.D. gave them away as the photos showed them with hats on. The police never photo their employees with a hat on.
