North Rauceby & South Rauceby Affordable Housing Needs Roadshow

If you live in North or South Rauceby, find out more about housing you can afford by coming to a Roadshow at Rauceby Village Hall, Main Street, South Rauceby 3:30pm and 6:30pm, on Friday, 14 December 2007.

North Kesteven District Council Housing Department and Housing Associations will have representatives available to talk though your options, and answer your questions on affordable housing, the housing register, grants for disabled facilities and adaptations, affordable warmth and energy efficiency.

North Kesteven District Council and Rauceby Parish Councils are giving local people the opportunity to complete a questionnaire during December, so that demand for affordable housing in the area can be assessed over the next five years, and potentially new homes provided.

A questionnaire is being delivered with this newsletter to every home in the villages to help find out what North and South Rauceby's existing and future needs are for affordable housing.

Rural Housing Enabler, Bob Keech said that, "The aim of the survey is to discover whether there is a need for affordable homes to support local people to stay in the communities they grew up in, or to find affordable homes in North or South Rauceby if they have a strong local connection with the

settlement. With rising house prices local younger people and first time buyers are finding open market housing out of reach, and the result of this survey may help them find a local home. If anyone has any questions about the survey we hope they will come along to the Roadshow".

Affordable housing is that where rent or mortgage costs are less than 25% of a household's income, after tax and national insurance. You may be in need of affordable housing if you need help to secure a:-

Larger home
Smaller home
Physically adapted home
Cheaper accommodation
Home closer to work
Home closer to a carer or dependent (to give or receive support)
Home away from harassment
Secure home
Home of a different tenure, or

These surveys are being done in a number of rural communities throughout the District during the next 6 months. The overall aim of this is to provide affordable housing where it is needed.

Home that is independent.

District Councillor, Stewart Ogden, Executive Board Member with responsibility for Housing, said: "Affordable housing is one of our main priorities for this year. House prices have soared in recent years and many homes are now out of reach of the District's residents.

"In a bid to balance this, we have changed our planning requirements so that developers must now allocate 35% of homes as affordable on sites of five or more dwellings. The Council is looking at its own land holdings with a view to releasing them for development where possible, and will consider 'exception sites' in settlements where there is proven need".
