

St. Peter's Needs Window Repairs.

In 2004 our architect, Peter McFarlane, carried out his programmed Quinquennial inspection of the church fabric and structure. He focused principally on the 5 year period up to the end of 2009. The need for window repairs was identified. Since then the condition of both the stonework mullions and the glass has deteriorated. Quite apart from the effects of the passage of time and a 'settling' of the glazing, the stonework has been damaged as aresult of corrosion of integral 'strengthening' iron bars.

Now is the time for action if major damage is to be

avoided with structural failure in the windows. The architect has identified 12 windows in the north and south aisle and chancel which require repairs. Although some were less urgent than others the Church Council aim to proceed with all 12 windows.

All necessary approvals were obtained from the Lincoln Diocesan authorities and the Faculty granted. Specifications were drawn up, tenders invited and contractors selected. The planis for work to start in the Spring and it should take some two months. The Church should not need to close during this time.

The total cost is of the order of some £18,000, although we must be alert to the possibility of some increase once work commences, should hidden faults be detected. Church windows have this reputation!

Fund raising efforts are now clearly focused on this project with most recent being the excellent supper evening at Rauceby Hall. A particular thank you to Gillian, all who worked so hard with the organisation and support; and all who were present for a thoroughly enjoyable evening. The event raised in the region of £1750. The present team is standing down, but Gillian has most generouly offered the Hall for a new team next year, volunteers please.

The Club would like to make a plea for new Members as, over the last 2 or 3 years, the Membership has fallen. At the time of writing this, members who have recently renewed their annual subscription, a mere £4 per person per annum, number 25, of which 13 are Rauceby residents. The Club was set up in late 1992 so it is now in its 16th year and indebted to a sizeable group of founder members who, needless to say, are growing older.

The Club meets in the village hall, for the months of September to April inclusive, normally the fourth Tuesday in those months, at 7.30pm. Speakers, who are engaged from far and wide, generally compliment their talks with a slide show and in the past the expenditure on speakers has been around £500 per annum. The only way the Club survives financially is by way of the annual Coffee and Plant sale in April.

But, financing the Club is not the be all and end all. Membership levels and regular support are so important. Speakers generally spend at least 2

hours with us (they only speak for approximately 1 hour) but they might spend an additional 2 - 4 hours, some even more, travelling. The Club does try to attain an attendance of around 30 persons per meeting as a minimum; if we only have an attendance of around 20 people it has to be disappointing for the Speaker having regard to the size of the Hall and his/her enthusiasm and for the committee. Incidentally, non - members are always welcome and are charged £1 per meeting.

The Club does not expect Members or Visitors to be award winning gardeners, or the like, but rather people who enjoy their gardens and plants, who want to improve their horticultural knowledge, and enjoy the friendly atmosphere at our meetings which spills over at our December meeting in particular. We are confident that there are a lot more local people who would enjoy what the Club has to offer. Please make a special effort to support us.

The Earthquake -

Natural Disaster or Manmade Catastrophe

There are concerns that the earthquake that shook Britain in the early hours of Wednesday 27th February 2008 was not an act of nature.

RAF Faldingworth which was developed in the 1950's as a Nuclear weapons store has in recent years been used as a munitions test site. The tests that have been carried out involve numerous underground explosions. These have taken place four days a week for the past eighteen months and at times as many as one explosion every twenty minutes.

Local residents have been campaigning for them to stop. West Lindsey Council have made nuisance readings and have found that the company carrying out the tests of national interest are in fact acting within government guidelines. The explosions are causing damage to local property and causing misery for residents.

There is a fear that the numerous explosions may well be affecting the natural balance of seismic activity in the area.

The recent earthquake was large by UK standards measuring from between 4.7 magnitude to 5.3 magnitude on the Richter scale. It caused untold damage to properties, one serious injury, and was felt throughout Britain.

Earthquakes such as this are rare. Between 200-300 quakes occur in Britain each year but only 10 per cent are strong enough to be felt. The last two big ones were in Dudley in 2002(4.7M) and Lleyn Peninsula in North Wales in 1984(5.4M). There is documentary evidence of seismic activity in Lincolnshire back as far as the twelfth century when in 1185, Lincoln Cathedral was destroyed by one.

It does seem peculiar that the epicentre for this last occurrence was at Market Rasen, which is right on top of the test facility at RAF Faldingworth.

There is evidence that underground nuclear testing can induce this kind of phenomenon. Could it in fact be possible that an accumulation of explosions of the kind at RAF Faldingworth over a long period such as this have a similar effect.

With all the other damage mankind has done to our Earth in the name of progress, it is not a huge leap of faith to presume that Mankind may well have been responsible for this event and was not just natural seismic activity as has been suggested.

Derek Simpson

26.01.1929 - 19.11 2007

Derek Simpson of Main Street North Rauceby passed away peacefully in his sleep on the 19th November 2007.

Derek had a ten year spell in the RAF between 1948 and 1958 and spent time in Egypt during his service. Derek married his wife Joy in October 1959 and soon after moved into a cottage in North Rauceby. They met through mutual friends, Aubrey Wells and Molly one night at the Bustard Inn when they had all gone to listen to a 'skiffle' group play.

Derek played football for Sleaford town and cricket for both the Sleaford and Rauceby teams. He was employed by David Bratley as Pig man and Shepherd.

Derek and Joy had two sons Stephen, who now

lives in Bury St Edmunds and Paul who tragically died at only thirty-five after a massive heart attack whilst shepherding.

The family later moved to South Rauceby when Derek was employed on the Rauceby estate as a shepherd. He had a wicked sense of humour and was always telling the 'Boss', Gillian Hoare, very naughty jokes! He was a bit of a prankster and used to leave cartoons on the chalkboard in the lambing sheds, which were always a source of great entertainment. He retired from shepherding aged 62 with bad hips. Derek was always inventing things.



As a lad (or 'Old Boy' as they say in these parts) he got into terrible mischief. He and some of his mates had been playing with carbide down at the willow pits. They had put it in to bottles and one accidentally went off. They had to tell the parents a whitie and ended up having the bomb squad round to comb the willow pits for butterfly bombs. On another occasion he hid in the cattle grid at the hall to greet the WAAF' s on their way home. Little tinker!

Derek was very involved in many of the clubs and committee's in the village. He was a founder member of the bowls club and for many years the mainstay of all of its activities. Due to ill health had give much of it up. He continued to be a Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinator right up until his death.

His funeral was at St Peter's Church at 12.15 on the 30th November 2007. It was a wonderful service and a full house. The family left the church to Andrea Bocelli's 'Time To Say Good bye'. Derek will be sadly missed and we all give our condolences to Joy his wife and family and Geoff his brother.



Reduced Carbon Footprint Souvenirs

12 April - 8 June 2008





The Hub: National Centre for Craft & Design presents in the Window Space Héctor Serrano from 12 April – 8 June 2008.

Exhibited in his Window Space Exhibition, Héctor Serrano has created a collection of 'Reduced Carbon Footprint Souvenirs'. These objects are virtual souvenirs that can be sent to friends or family via email, and then materialize using a 3D printer (stereolithography rapid prototyping) – saving on transport and printing and so minimising your 'travelling' carbon footprint. The project questions the way that souvenirs are manufactured and how new technologies propose alternative ways of reducing their environmental impact, such as rapid prototyping.

Serrano is the design office established by Héctor Serrano in London in 2000. Their projects combine innovation with the communication of familiar ideas in unusual and inventive ways. The studio's client list includes Droog Design, Metalarte, La Casa Encendida (Caja Madrid) and Valencia City Council. The office has received different awards such as the Peugeot Design Award and the Premio Nacional de Diseno No Abburriods. Their Products have been exhibited extensively in Museums such as the V&A in London and Cooper-Hewit National Design Museum in New York. Hector was born in Valencia, Spain, in 1974 where he studied Industrial and Graphic Design at ESDI Ceu University, before moving to London to study a master's degree in Product Design at the Royal College of Art. This project was sponsored by 3D Systems.

Roof Gallery Mechanical Drawing: The Schiffli Project from 8 March – 27 April 2008. The Schiffli Project documents and explores textile practice and process through twenty pieces of commissioned work on the UK's last working schiffli machine.




