We have 50 'Smart Meters' available for a two month loan from October to the end of November. At the end of July 2008 a group of Rauceby residents got together for the first meeting of the Rauceby Little Footprint Initiative. These people are not the usual tree huggers and environmental activists, but a group of people who

all have the same vision. That vision is to focus on allowing our community to develop into a model of sustainability, both social and environmental.

Through SustainNK, the RLFI is offering an incredibly exciting initiative to the first fifty households to contact The Rauceby Parish News to be involved with a trial involving the 'Smart Meter'. The Smart Meter is an intuitive little gadget that monitors the amount of electricity we use in our homes. It helps you to understand which appliances, gadgets and fixtures within your home are the most energy demanding and allows you to decide where you can make changes so as to reduce your bills and your environmental impact. In fact every home should have one.

There will come a time when our government will dictate (and if you think things times are tough now, just wait and see what the future holds), the way in which we live and consume energy.

The high cost of oil is increasingly becoming a burden for those of us who rely on oil fired central heating. In the past Iain and I have used 'Boiler Juice' but it has become clear that other suppliers are willing to undercut them if ordering direct, therefore the savings in using the website have minimised. I am therefore proposing that we organise our own 'Village purchase' which will include North and South Rauceby. I am willing to organise this on behalf of anyone interested but I want to test it to see if this is manageable (for me) and cost effective.



I would suggest that we try a 'test purchase' at the end of November. If anyone is interested they need to email me the following:

Your name, address postcode and contact telphone number. The amount of litres you wish to purchase. To let me have this information between the 21st and 29th November. I will phone round and negotiate on your behalf and order by Monday 1st December for delivery during that week. I will let you know the price I have negotiated per litre via email, and let you know the suppliers preferable method of payment (hopefully by cheque). I will let the supplier have your details and you can settle your bill direct with the supplier

Neighbourhood Watch Column - James Malloch

News from Lincolnshire Police Watchline during recent weeks seems to indicate that, whilst the UK economy may be slowing down, the local criminal fraternity are bucking the trend and keeping their productivity rates high! There have been several house burglaries in the Sleaford area (including one in the Spinneys and one in Pinfold Lane) whilst the owners were away. Police advise us - let your neighbours know when your house is going to be unoccupied for any length of time, cancel your papers and leave an inside light working on a timer, it may give the appearance that someone is at home. Trailers have been stolen from nearby villages, and Satnav devices taken from cars parked in driveways. We also have information about a prolific car thief who lives in Heckington and who has just been released from prison - be aware! During the second week of August two Land Rover Defenders were stolen from rural locations by persons who arrived to commit the crime using a Land Rover style vehicle. If you have a similar vehicle please ensure it is locked if left unattended.

The Editor has asked me to appeal for your help in monitoring large heavy lorries that use our village roads as a shortcut to Sleaford - sometimes to avoid the weigh station on the A17. Several villagers have witnessed long articulated lorries becoming stuck in South Rauceby on tight bends. Our road infrastructure is not designed to take such vehicles and the Editor wishes to compile a dossier of incidents to present to the Highways authority. If you witness any large vehicles having similar difficulties please take a note of the date and time, the registration and name of the haulage company and let the Editor know – thank you.

We do need more Neighbourhood Watch coordinators in our villages. To date we only have three in South Rauceby, and two in North Rauceby. This means there are areas of the Raucebys that have no-one receiving information from the Watchline. Information can be obtained from your local coordinators or Martin Dickie our crime prevention and Neighbourhood Watch officer at Lincoln on 01522 885326.

Our Neighbourhood Policing Team have secured a sum of money for local policing issues and following a discussion at a villages cluster group meeting it was decided that speeding through our villages was a major worry. The money is to be used to purchase a mobile warning sign which informs drivers of their speed via a flashing matrix. The Team will also buy a speed gun.

PCSO Colin Ironmonger, one of our Policing team, demonstrated the effectiveness of the existing gun to me recently. Within five minutes of its deployment we witnessed a driver who, whilst blatantly speeding, also overtook another car still inside the 40mph limit. We are clearly on a 'rat run' between the A17 and the Sleaford/ Greylees area and too many people use our village roads to demonstrate how quickly they can drive – not a clever idea! The Policing Team will be visiting our villages over the next few weeks with the new equipment. Take care and drive safely....

There is very little to report from the Parish Council since the last newsletter. The Parish Open Meeting was held in May. It was expected that a member of the Police Authority would attend, but they let us down at the last minute and sent us a DVD to watch that explained the reasons behind the dramatic rise in the Council Tax demand. A real person would have been much more helpful – the DVD was not good at answering questions! The main concerns raised were about the speed and quantity of traffic in the villages. We are trying to gain the use of some speed detection devices available to the Parish.

The next meetings of the Parish Council will be Tuesday 2nd September 2008 and Tuesday 4th November 2008. The Parish Open Meeting for next year is Tuesday 5th May 2009.

Buses Only Come In Threes? - Or Do They?

A new on-demand minibus for the Kesteven area was recently launched. You may have read about it in the Target.

The CallConnect service has been introduced by the county council for the cliff villages in the North, Cranwell and Rauceby in the east, Belton in the south and Newark in the west.

It is designed to link up with mainline bus services, or for passengers to access local shops, attractions, leisure centres or medical services.

By booking in advance(from up to seven days to two hours ahead, subject to availability) passengers can travel to any location in the operating area.

The translinc service runs Monday to Saturday from 7am - 7pm. Concessionary bus passes are accepted.

Coun William Webb, portfolio holder for passenger transport, said it furthered " our commitment to integrated public transport and access from outlying areas to the stretegic bus network.
