





Nature On The Verge Project Map Ref No. I

There are wide verges along Church Lane leading out of North Rauceby and Mark will be investigating the available flora and fauna.

Bird Ringing Map Ref No. 2

Grantham & Sleaford Bird Ringing Group

This will be going on in the parkland near the Lodge and is ideal for people to see as they enter the site. The bird ringers will be moving around the parkland during the day.

Freshwater Invertebrates Map Ref No. 3

The south-eastern end of the lake is a shallow slope with access all the way across. There is also a water fall running from the lake nearby.

Garden Birds Map Ref No. 6 - Other gardens


